Air Strike will include an expanded Theatre and Doctrine Card list for historical games.

Theatre cards and Weather. As part of Air Strike we are looking at making weather more important in historical games. When players are selecting theatre cards in historical games one card per side MUST be an applicable weather card. Where there is a clash of incompatible weather cards dice to see which takes precedence. Note Arctic Conditions and Tropical Conditions are NOT weather cards and cannot be countered by using the Met Office card. The list below includes some that are not available at the moment

Balancing Forces – the 'Numbers' and 'Home Advantage' theatre cards

Numbers and Home Advantage are two very powerful Theatre cards included for historical scenarios and generally should not be used for competitive games.

However, many of the new Air strike scenarios are asymmetric with an 'attacking' and 'defending' force pursuing different objectives. The assumption is that the opposing forces will have roughly equivalent starting numbers of aircraft and/or points values and the scenarios are written with that in mind.

Where appropriate one side may be permitted to use the 'Numbers' and/or the 'Home Advantage' Theatre cards by a scenario as a way of balancing out the other side's advantage in bombers, victory conditions, Flak defences etc.
