

CARRO ARMATO M13/40 OR M14/41 & SEMOVENTE 75/18 ASSEMBLY AND PAINTING GUIDE



The Carro Armato M13/40 was an Italian World War II tank designed to replace the M11/39 in the Italian Army at the start of World War II. It was the primary tank used by the Italians throughout the war. The design was influenced by the British Vickers 6-Ton and was based on the modified chassis of the earlier M11/39.

The name refers to 'M' for *Medio* (medium) according to the Italian tank weight standards at the time, 13 tons was the scheduled weight and 1940 the initial year of production.

The M13/40 was used in the Greek campaign in 1940 and 1941 and in the North African Campaign. The M13/40 was not used on the Eastern Front, Italian forces there were equipped only with L6/40s and Semovente 47/32s. Beginning in 1942, the Italian Army recognized the firepower weakness of the M13/40 series and employed the Semovente 75/18 self-propelled gun alongside the tanks in their armoured units.

Follow this simple guide to build your Carro Armato M13/40 or M14/41 or Semovente 75/18.


Carefully remove each component from the frame with clippers or a craft knife. Trim off excess plastic before assembling. Test fit all parts before applying glue.


We recommend using polystyrene cement to assemble the kit, and to use this in a well-ventilated area.


Keep tools, glues, paints and small components away from children. Warlord Games recommend this kit for ages 14 and over.


DECAL APPLICATION GUIDE


- Apply a coat of gloss varnish to the areas that will receive the decal and allow this to dry fully.
- Cut out a decal from the sheet and soak it in luke warm water for 2-3 minutes.
- Once the design has started to separate from the backing paper, use tweezers or a wet paintbrush to slide the design into place on the model.
- Use a tissue to dab away any excess water from the model, and allow to dry.
- Apply a coat of matt varnish to seal the decal in place.



















Semovente 75/18 M40 or M41 self-propelled gun.



















Follow stages L-S for Carro Armato M13/40 or M14/41 medium tanks only.






Italian army Carro Armato M14/41 in in single tone scheme - Albania, March 1941.














Italian army Semovente 75/18 in three tone camouflage - Italy, September 1943.
